EXHIBITOR TERMS & CONDITIONS

A signature on the Registration Form is required for participation in Earth Fair. Please retain this document for your records.

- ◆ St. Clair County Earth Fair (Earth Fair) is a 501c3 non-profit organization committed to environmental education in St. Clair County, and as such, sponsors this annual event. The main purpose of this event is educational and staged in conjunction with Earth Day and its mission.
- ◆ The Exhibitor shall remain on the premises for the entire duration of the two-day event. The Exhibitor shall not dismantle or otherwise interfere with the orderly conduct and display of the exhibits until Earth Fair is officially closed to the public each day.
- ◆ Each Exhibitor is required to keep at least one attendant in his booth during all event hours. Failure to do so may result in removal of an exhibit from the event at his expense. Volunteer assistance can be provided at a booth if requested by Exhibitor.
- ◆ Merchandise, signs, decorations or display fixtures shall not be nailed to walls. No components shall be displayed outside exhibit space or beyond limits of exhibit space as to interfere with any neighboring exhibit.
- ◆ An Exhibitor shall not assign to a third party its right to the exhibit space or any portion thereof without the prior consent of Earth Fair. The Exhibitor shall assume full responsibility for the conduct of the assignee and all its representatives, and the Exhibitor shall not charge its assignee more than a proportionate share of the exhibit fee based upon the amount of exhibit space assigned.
- ◆ Earth Fair reserves the right to make changes in space assignments that it deems are in the overall best interest of the event. Booth space will be assigned by Earth Fair on the basis of the order in which the Registration Form and payment are received. Such assignment is made for the period of this event only and does not imply that the same or similar space be held or offered for future events.
- ◆ Earth Fair reserves the right to withdraw its acceptance of the registration form if it determines that the Exhibitor's product or service does not meet the event's mission. In addition, Earth Fair may refuse to consider for participation in future events an Exhibitor who violates or fails to abide by all such Terms & Conditions.
- ◆ Earth Fair is a smoke-free, tobacco-free event. This applies to Exhibitors and Visitors. No use of tobacco products is permitted on the premises at any time.
- ◆ Photographs will be taken during the event without prior consent of Exhibitors to be used in marketing materials, websites, social media, and publications.
- ◆ Earth Fair is striving to be a Zero Waste event. Exhibitors must consider their impact to the environment when planning activities for their booth, i.e. volume of waste, recycling, composting. Free technical support is provided to assist in minimizing waste at Earth Fair.

- ◆ If Exhibitor cancels its participation in the event, such cancellation shall be considered a default on its part, and any monies paid hereunder shall be retained by Earth Fair.
